Encouraged by the Dean of Students at Cal-State Los Angeles, Alton took remedial English at Santa Monica City College and then transferred to Cal-State, where he met an instructor who taught him to write. One year later, in 1969, he published a book of poetry entitled *Something of Feeling*. Later, Alton became a Certified Addictions Counselor and was employed with the United States Navy in that capacity until he retired in January of 1997. Throughout and currently, Alton has continued to write. He has over fifteen books of poetry in traditional print, and currently resides in Oceanside, CA.
